They collected some beautiful pearls.

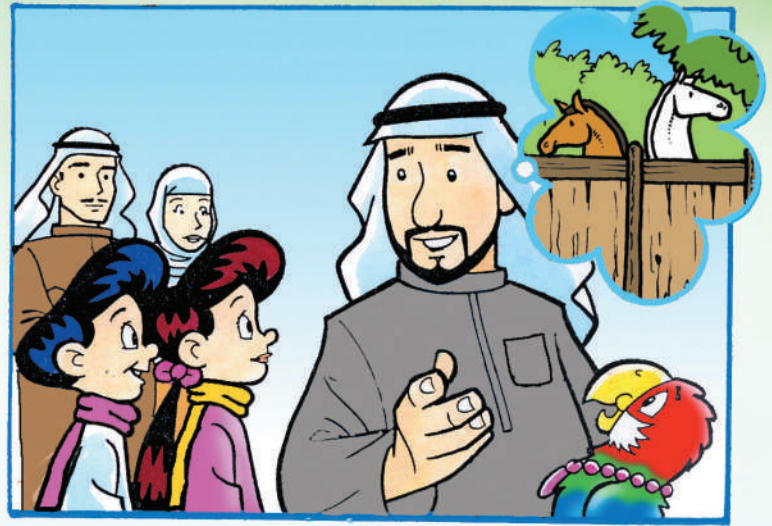

It was a nice day!



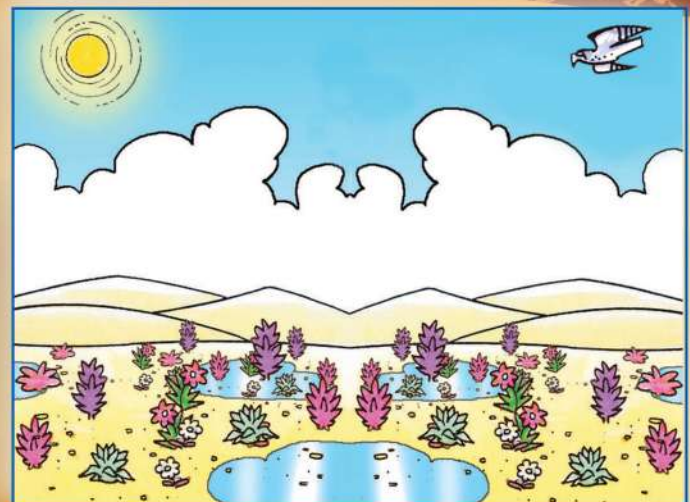
